THE GOOT OF THE RESOURCE



- → To compensate you for your time, energy, invaluable intellect, creative work (and actual art making), travel and accommodation needs, we offer a remuneration of \$10,000.
- → The materials budget is separate. You will receive \$5,000 to make your inspired concept a reality. Don't worry, one of our good-with-money experts will help you to stay within budget.

THE BURS THERS

When we review your amazing application, we will be making big decisions based on the following things, so when writing your proposal, make sure you pay close attention to these questions:

- → Have you clearly showcased evidence of past works, demonstrating your ability to complete a high-quality creative project so that we can clearly see how amazing and capable you are?
- → How does the project activate the Library's collection, spaces and culture?
- → Does the project clearly inspire playfulness, provoke curiosity, and/or encourage engagement with UTS Library, the UTS community and the general public?
- → Is the project actually feasible and practical within the timeline (approximately 6 months) and budget (approximately \$5000)?
- → Will this residency help you develop and advance your artistic and professional practice?

Feeling the urge to dive in but want to get a feel for things first? No worries! Drop an email to our program manager, Mia Turner at Mia.Turner@uts.edu.au. She'll set you up with a chance to swing by the Library, explore our spaces, ask your burning questions, and see if this residency vibes with your creative spirit. We're all about making sure it's a perfect fit for you. So, let's chat and see if we're a match made in library heaven!

*Brass facks: Details of immediate practical importance—usually used in the phrase 'get down to brass tacks'.

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Application due date: Before 12pm Monday 6 November 2023

In ONE PDF document with maximum size 10MB your application will include:

- → Project description (1 x A4 page). This is where you should address the proposed outcome of the residency and how you will achieve it (tell us what you want to do and how you want to do it). As well as address the proposed project's connection to the Library and the selection criteria (tell us why You + UTS Library = 2getha 4eva).
- → Include supporting documents. This could be links to websites where your work can be viewed, media articles where you have been reviewed, blogs or work-in-progress pages. (Basically, your opportunity to be like "Look at me!" and "Yeah, this is why I am the Sh*t").
- → Your CV (please only 2 pages max).
- → Short biography (tell us all about you and your recent achievements in 500 words or less). Include recent exhibitions, awards, grants, residencies, published papers, etc. (yes, we like knowing everything, it's a Library thing).
- → Examples of recent work with captioned images. Choose
 2-10 recent works to show us using a maximum of 10 images.

A very important notes Residency applications are open to all creatures great and small, and applicants do not need to be affiliated with UTS to apply for this residency. Meaning, if you are keen as a bean to apply, go for it! We can't wait to read your application.

and anothers If your proposal has been unsuccessful in the past, we encourage you to apply again. However, if you are applying again, please do not submit the same proposal. Show us that you have developed your ideas and refined your work since the last application, as this demonstrates a real commitment to your practice. It is okay to use the same support images but if you have recent works, include those too.

one mores UTS Library reserves the right not to proceed with any appointment. (Just covering our bases here.)

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- → Applications open: Monday 2 October 2023
- → Applications close: 12pm Monday 6 November 2023
- → The successful applicant will be notified by Friday 22 December 2023.
- → The contract commencement date will be approximately 1st week of March 2024 and the contract end date will be approximately 30th August 2024. Please note: the 6-month residency is inclusive of initial planning meetings and administrative periods.
